The First Tee of Aiken provides an affordable and accessible golf facility to those who have not previously had exposure to the game and its positive values. Our goal is for participants to internalize The First Tee Life Skills Experience's Nine Core Values, which are at the heart of The First Tee mission. Through the National School Program and after-school programming, The First Tee of Aiken is currently reaching over 9,300 children, which is 35.6 percent of the youth in the Aiken community.
